Free IPAC Compliance Checklist

Use this checklist as a starting point to assess and improve your infection prevention protocols:

General Office Setup

- Clearly defined clean and contaminated zones
- □ Separate handwashing sinks (not used for instrument cleaning)
- □ Sharps containers in appropriate, easily accessible locations
- Proper ventilation and airflow systems

Sterilization Area

- Dedicated sterilization area with one-way workflow (dirty to clean)
- □ Functional ultrasonic cleaner and/or washer-disinfector
- □ Regular maintenance logs for sterilizers (autoclaves)
- □ Biological indicator tests (spore tests) performed weekly

Instrument Reprocessing

- □ Proper cleaning before sterilization
- Packaging and labeling before autoclaving
- □ Sterilization indicators used in every load
- □ Logs of sterilization cycles maintained and reviewed

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- □ Masks, gloves, eye protection, and gowns available for all staff
- □ Proper donning and doffing procedures followed
- □ PPE replaced between patients or when compromised

Hand Hygiene

- □ Alcohol-based hand rub and soap available in all treatment areas
- □ Staff trained in hand hygiene techniques
- □ Hand hygiene performed before and after every patient interaction



Environmental Cleaning

- □ High-touch surfaces disinfected between patients
- Daily and weekly cleaning checklists followed
- □ Approved disinfectants used (DIN-registered)
- □ Disposable barriers used where appropriate

IPAC Policies & Training

- □ Written IPAC policies and procedures accessible to staff
- □ All team members trained on IPAC annually
- □ IPAC Officer designated and trained
- □ Ongoing internal audits or self-assessments scheduled
